Dear Friends,

Last month I wrote about our Anglican heritage and some of the ways in which we stand in the tradition of the Oxford Movement of the early nineteenth century. Many people thanked me for that bit of history and several have suggested that I write more about our Anglican heritage.

The Anglican Communion, of which the Episcopal Church is a part, is both Catholic and Reformed, as we teach in the catechism. That is to say, we are not really part of the Church that understands itself to be Protestant. In fact in this country for some years the Episcopal Church called itself the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States of America (PECUSA), but dropped the title, "Protestant" in the late 1970's because we don't really fit the Protestant mold.

There are at least four important differences between Anglican and Protestant practice. First, we preserve the Apostolic succession through the bishops of our church who trace their spiritual authority, teaching, and faith to Peter, the first Apostle. Some Churches have bishops, for example, the Methodist and Lutheran Churches, but their understanding of the episcopate is quite different. Their bishops are not consecrated "bishop" for life, rather they function as administrators for a fixed term.

Secondly, we hold to the ancient creeds as the full expression our faith, not to some later document, like the Augsburg confession (Lutherans) or the Westminster confession (Presbyterians). Third, we have preserved the traditional orders of ministry: bishop, priest, and deacon. The "new" catechism in the *Book of Common Prayer*, 1979, also speaks of the lay order as also being an "order" of ministry. The understanding is that when one is confirmed into the one, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic faith of the Episcopal Church one is "ordered" for ministry, specifically "to take their place in the life, worship, and governance of the Church" (BCP, p.855). Further, we observe the traditional seven sacraments: Holy Baptism, Holy Eucharist, Confirmation, Holy Matrimony, Ordination, Confession (now called Reconciliation), and Holy Unction (anointing). Each of those sacraments has a rite, in the *Book of Common Prayer*.

One further difference: we use the entire Bible in our worship. The Protestants do not recognize the Apocrypha as part of their Scriptures, nor do they use the Apocrypha in their worship. If you are purchasing a Bible, make sure that the Bible you purchase includes the Apocrypha. Sometimes those Bibles are called the "Catholic" Bible.

Musical Notes for June

We will close our official choir season with Trinity Sunday and a bit of celebration. The 8:30 and 11:00 am services will feature the music of Joseph Haydn, in celebration of the 200th anniversary of his death. The offertory anthem will be “The Heavens Are Telling,” from his oratorio *The Creation*. During the 11:00 am service we sing movements from his Missa “Rorate Coeli.” Members of the choir will also continue to offer their talents as they are able during the summer to lead the congregation in worship. There are no Wednesday rehearsals, but we will often sing one Communion anthem with those who wish to participate. Short rehearsals will be held on Sunday mornings before the services. During the rest of June we will be offering music by Bruckner, Handel, and the English Baroque composer, Michael Wise.

However, our music program will soon continue in its summer clothing. We will again be fortunate to welcome **Opera Apprentices** into our midst to share their wonderful talents. We are thankful for our Apprentice Sponsors Ashley Margetson and Kathryn Anson. Look for our first Apprentices to sing on Sunday, June 14, for the special Evensong and Benediction service for the Feast of Corpus Christi. During the rest of the month of June they will sing beloved works from Handel’s *Messiah* and Mendelssohn’s *Elijah*.

Corpus Christi (Latin for “Body of Christ”) is a Christian feast in honor of the Holy Eucharist. It was originally assigned to the Thursday following Trinity Sunday, thereby mirroring Maundy Thursday, the Thursday of Holy Week, the day on which Christians commemorate The Last Supper of Jesus Christ and his apostles, seen as the first Holy Eucharist. However, we will celebrate it at 6:00 pm on Sunday, June 14. The musical program will feature the beautiful, but rarely performed Evening Service by Felix Mendelssohn. We sing it in honor of the 200th anniversary of his birth. In addition, our Opera Apprentices will sing the popular “Panis Angelicus,” by Franck, and the lovely “O Salutaris Hostia,” by Rossini.

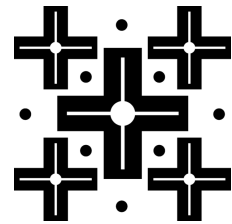
INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS

“It has always been my ambition to preach the gospel where Christ was not known, so that I would not be building on someone else’s foundation.” Romans 15:20

This verse could be the motto of all frontier mission-minded Christians! Paul was certainly a leader in the early Church both in spiritual and organizational matters. I am sure that Paul would look with full approval on the creative efforts taking place today to preach the gospel where Christ as Savior is not yet known.

A good example is the use of satellite TV in the Arab world. When I was in Egypt in March, I was struck by the “dense forests” of satellite dishes on top of all buildings. While in Cairo, I met with a community of Christians committed to proclaiming the Gospel on TV in the Arab world. As we sat visiting, the International Director came in and said that a production team in a North African country had just been arrested. It was interesting to me that the main concern was not for the team but for the tapes which happened to be the Psalms in two Berber languages! These were Psalms identified by Berber believers as suitable to have an impact on their Islamic culture and mindset.

On that particular day, the production team was shooting footage to go with the reading of the Psalms. The cameraman described the experience. “Today while filming someone must have reported us while we stopped to ask for direction and film in the middle of a village. Three police cars came and asked us to follow them to the station. But after they took all our details down and heard what I was doing, they were very courteous and released us with no problems. They even sent someone to make sure that no one interrupts our filming while in the area. We exchanged telephone numbers with the chief officer who said to contact him in case we encounter any further problems with police in other areas. God is good. So now that the police know who we are and what we are doing, we have their unofficial blessing and protection. I just want to give thanks for God’s goodness and His protection over us. I have never experienced God’s provision in a more powerful way.”



Pray that the Lord will foster in us this same creative ambition to preach the Gospel where Christ is not named.

Property Notes

Even though we had some technical difficulties with the presentation equipment, the presentation at the Adult Forum on May 17, was quite successful based on the feedback we have received. We reviewed the status of the 2009 property improvement projects that are still have funding and identified some of the projects that will have to carry over into 2010 along with some new projects being discussed. Anyone that was not present and wishes to learn more may contact Scott or Bill.

By August 1, we will be submitting the list of 2010 projects along with the 2010 proposed property budget. We welcome input from everyone as to which projects or improvements should be addressed in 2010. These are the repairs, upgrades, replacements, furnishings, equipment, etc. needs that get funded out of the capital fund. Plus, we continue to welcome members with the skills and interests that would like to assist with a particular project. Your expertise or connections can help the church to save money while still receiving top quality service from a vendor.

In June Doug Fraser will be assisting with the replacement of part of the sidewalk and the curbing discussed in last month's *Faith Way*. This work is scheduled to begin on June 8, and will last for several days. Please make note that part of the parking lot will be unavailable and you may be directed to use a different entrance to Conkey House during these few days.

This summer Jim Overton will be assisting with an upgrade of the audio system in the church. He is currently helping with the audit of what are the audio needs and what are viable solutions and their costs.

Thank you to those who have stepped forward to help with the grounds care this summer. Your help gives the church a welcoming appearance to our visitors and potential new members. The maintenance of the grounds is a constant need, and we continue to seek volunteers to assist.

This summer we will need to continue to limit the labor hours of the part time sextons to help meet this year's budget, so there will be some Saturdays and evenings when there may not be a sexton on duty. If you have a need to be at the church after normal hours and need a sexton present, please make sure your meeting is noted on the church calendar or contact Bill to let him know of your need.

Please note, Bill will be on vacation starting June 17 and will return to work on July 1. Monday through Friday the evening sexton will be on duty, and the weekend sextons will be on duty for the two weekends while he is gone.

Starting in July the work to repair the Palen Hall boiler will begin. We are stretching the work out over the summer to help spread out the payments. We have been informed that part of the repair costs will be eligible for reimbursement from the church's insurance. We will not know the exact amount until after the work is completed and the proper documents have been submitted for reimbursement.

We have also been informed that the repair of the Conkey House parapet is not eligible under our insurance coverage. That cost will need to come out of the capital fund. The cost estimate so far is \$27,095. Authorization for allocation of additional money to be withdrawn from the endowment to cover this cost is being requested. We feel that this is a safety concern that needs to be addressed soon. We still need the approval of the Historical Review Board before a city license will be issued for the work. We plan to have this work done in September to allow for proper curing of the mortar before the cold weather begins. If we can not get the approval within time and it gets too late in the fall, this project will be postponed until the spring of 2010.

May Vestry Highlights

The following are highlights from the May 21, 2009 Vestry meeting:

- ? The Vestry voted unanimously to appoint Robert Jones as Treasurer. Jane Amos was nominated to fill the vacant Vestry seat, and was elected unanimously. Her term runs until 2010.
- ? The Vestry approved a Finance Committee recommendation to accept a new contract with Get Easy Advertising. The contract includes payment for previous work done that was in excess of the dollar amount approved in August, 2008; and a breakdown of work to be done to complete the site. The total approved was \$2,880.09.
- ? The Vestry also approved a Finance Committee recommendation to increase the Altar Guild's 2009 budget by \$1,200. It was noted that the original amount budgeted did not meet the need for basic supplies for services (wine, candles, etc.). The funds will come from the Contingency line item of the 2009 Budget.
- ? May's income, as of the date of the meeting, exceeded the amount anticipated. Plate offerings are still much lower than expected.

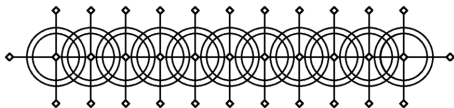

Faith at Work Community Outreach

Thank you for your generosity of the past month. We received a good number of items that have been passed on to our clients and other support organizations with which we work.

Due to the number of households we are assisting in set-up, we currently have need for the following house wares: pots and pans, crock pots, cooking utensils, coffee makers, shower curtains and window curtains. Furniture needs include beds—especially twin and double size—love seats and couches, side chairs, tables and chairs and end tables. Several clients are moving out of homeless status and others are downsizing after evictions or foreclosure.

Clothing needs include men's and women's denims, tees of all sizes, canvas shoes, cotton sox and men's boxer shorts in sizes L, XL and XXL. Food items we need weekly are the meals in a can, snacks and juices for the First Contact Teen Outreach in support of Santa Fe's homeless teenagers.

Our major fundraiser, Art & Soul is scheduled Friday evening, June 5, at the Church of the Holy Faith. A large group of committed volunteers led by Faith at Work board member Gib Mason has planned and organized an outstanding Gala Reception and Auction to raise funds that will be used to support the financial needs of our clients. Please plan to attend or make a contribution to Faith at Work. The funds raised will be used to assist our clients with their financial needs and are very much appreciated.

When client requests for assistance increased the last quarter of 2008, we increased our financial support from \$5,000 to \$6,000/month—and we continue to run out of funds by the middle of the month. We know we cannot begin to meet all requests, however, we would like to assist as many families and individuals as possible. One means of doing so is to stretch our capabilities with the FEMA monies we were granted to avoid homelessness. We are also requesting funds from the Obama Stimulus grants for Avoiding Homelessness and Re-housing. The needs in Santa Fe are great. We want to do our part to tend to our neighbors in need.


